

Leaves Around Us

A **riparian forest** consists of trees that are next to a stream or river. **Sidecut Metropark** is next to the **Maumee River**, so it is a riparian forest!

Although there are many variations, all trees use their leaves to eat. Since they don't eat food, they make their own! Energy from sunlight is transformed by the green leaves into a simple sugar in a process called **photosynthesis**.


