Wiregrass Lake: Wiregrass Lake is the first new area to open in the Corridor. Its dominate feature is the scenic lake, but look closer and discover the restored prairies. Dragonflies are numerous at this site, as well as birds and other wildlife.



Kitty Todd Preserve: The Nature Conservancy's 1,000-acre Kitty Todd Preserve is a centerpiece of the Oak Openings Region and is a model of land management practices for the region.



Louis W. Campbell Preserve: A microcosm of the botanically significant Oak Openings region in northwest Ohio, Lou Campbell State Nature Preserve is home to more than 30 state-listed species. High quality habitats include wet sedge meadows, swamp forest, sand dunes and sand barrens.



Wabash-Cannonball Trail: The trail follows two former rail lines forming a North Fork (9 miles paved) and South Fork (10 miles paved). These trails converge at Jerome Road in Maumee, near the Fallen Timbers Battlefield.



Irwin Prairie State Nature Preserve: Known for its summer wildflowers, the core of this preserve is a wet sedge meadow dominated by several species of sedges, rushes and wetland grasses. It is the finest remaining sedge meadow in Ohio! The preserve is actually composed of a mosaic of distinctive plant communities based on variations in water table levels.



Meilke Road Savanna: This Ohio Department of Natural Resources area, managed with assistance from Metroparks, is a secluded, sandy area where wild lupine and other rare plants grows. The property is one of the release sites for a Karner blue butterfly reintroduction program.



Westwinds: Located in the Corridor, Westwinds Metropark offers the park visitor a chance to hone their archery skills. This site is also the home of the Flying Tigers RC Model Club.
