PERMIT CONDITIONS

- The permittee will be responsible for providing a copy of this permit to all shooters. Shooters must possess a copy of this permit
 and, if required, a valid hunting license when operating under authority of this permit.
- 2. This permit may be utilized from sunrise to midnight unless otherwise noted in the special conditions section of this permit.
- This permit may NOT be utilized during any open deer gun season unless otherwise noted in the special conditions section of this permit.
- 4. The permit does NOT allow shooting from a motor vehicle contrary to ORC 2923.16.
- 5. The permittee shall attempt to make arrangements for deer killed to be consumed or used as the person issuing the permit directs. All deer not given away, kept by the permittee/landowner/listed shooter must be disposed of pursuant to ORC 941.14. Deer or parts (excluding antlers) thereof given to anyone must be accompanied with a copy of the Deer Damage Carcass Tag.
- 6. The shooter shall create a Deer Damage Carcass tag for each deer killed immediately after the deer dies. The Deer Damage Carcass Tag must be immediately attached to the deer and remain on the carcass until final disposition. You MUST check the deer in using one the methods described on page 3 of the permit within 5 business days of the deer being killed.
- 7. All antlers must be removed from each antlered deer killed under the authority of this permit within 24 hours of the deer being killed and destroyed or buried within seven days of the deer being killed. Under no circumstances may antlers from a deer killed under authority of this permit be possessed by anyone after being destroyed or buried.
- 8. Pursuant to OAC 1501:31-15-08 this permit is subject to revocation if the permittee and/or a shooter violates any of the listed conditions of this permit or an investigation by the Division of Wildlife determines a violation of ORC 1533.171 has occurred.
- The permittee understands that the Division of Wildlife will provide the names of Deer Damage Control Permit holders to anyone upon request per ORC 149.43.
- 10. In granting this Deer Damage Control Permit, the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife authorizes the permittee and/or permittee's agent(s) to shoot deer in order to reduce the effects of damage inflicted upon the permit holder's crops and/or property. The State of Ohio, Department of Natural Resources does not limit the scope of shooting activities allowed unless expressly prohibited and/or regulated by the stated "Conditions" of this permit, nor does it warrant any shooting activity conducted by the permittee and/or permittee's agent(s) to be safe, legal and applicable for the circumstances and/or locality for which this permit was issued.

By accepting this permit, the permittee and/or permittee's agent(s) assumes full responsibility for conducting all shooting activities in a safe, legal and responsible manner and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the State of Ohio-Department of Natural Resources, it's employees, officers, and agents from all liability associated with personal injury and/or property damage, loss and expense, including, but not limited to, damages, legal expenses and cost of defense, in any matter arising from the permittee's shooting activities.

Step 1 - TAGGING THE DEER

Tagging your deer killed on a Deer Damage Control Permit is very similar to temporary tagging a deer during hunting season. Every person who kills a deer under a deer damage permit must immediately:

- Make a Deer Damage Carcass Tag with shooter's name, date & time of kill, and Deer Damage Permit # (see example below)
- Attach the completed Deer Damage Carcass Tag to the deer at the place where it fell



Step 2 - REPORTING THE DEER

Within 5 business days of a deer killed on a Deer Damage Control Permit you <u>MUST</u> report it to the Division of Wildlife. There are 3 options for reporting your deer:



- The easiest and quickest option is to report your deer online at http://apps.ohiodnr.gov/wildlife/wildlifedamage/tagentry (you will need the permit and key number, located on the permit, to report your kill)
- Don't have internet? Check your deer by calling the district office that covers the county where the deer was killed (phone numbers on page 2 of the permit). You can call Mon.-Fri. between 8am-5pm.





Step 3 – WHAT TO DO WITH THE DEER

- If the deer has antlers, remove them and dipose of them according to the permit conditions.
- If you take a deer killed on a Deer Damage Permit to a processor for processing, you must provide them a copy of the Deer Damage Carcass Tag.
- If the deer is not getting utilized, properly dispose of the deer according to the permit conditions.

Per our discussion, below is further clarification regarding your Deer Damage Control Permit:

1. There are no restrictions on shooting times and this permit may be used during deer gun and muzzleloader

seasons.

- 2. No more than 25% of the deer culled may be antlered.
- 3. All deer culled in 2018 must be checked in per permit guidelines prior to the end of culling report to facilitate accurate cull numbers for the calendar year.
- 4. An end of culling report must be submitted no later than 60 days following the completion of culling activities to
