Fallen Timbers Battlefield: The Battle of Fallen Timbers, fought on August 20, 1794, is among the most historic conflicts fought on American soil.



Canal Locks: Although the canal no longer flows through Toledo, three of the limestone locks are preserved at Side Cut.



Fallen Timbers Monument: Memorializes the battle and the combatants. General Wayne's Legion, the American Indians and the Kentucky Militia.

Side Cut Metropark - Side Cut, the first Metropark is named for the former "side cut" extension of the Miami and Erie Canal that connected the main line of the canal with the city of Maumee. Three of the six original locks from the canal system are preserved here. Side Cut offers access to the Maumee River, the largest river in the Great Lakes.
